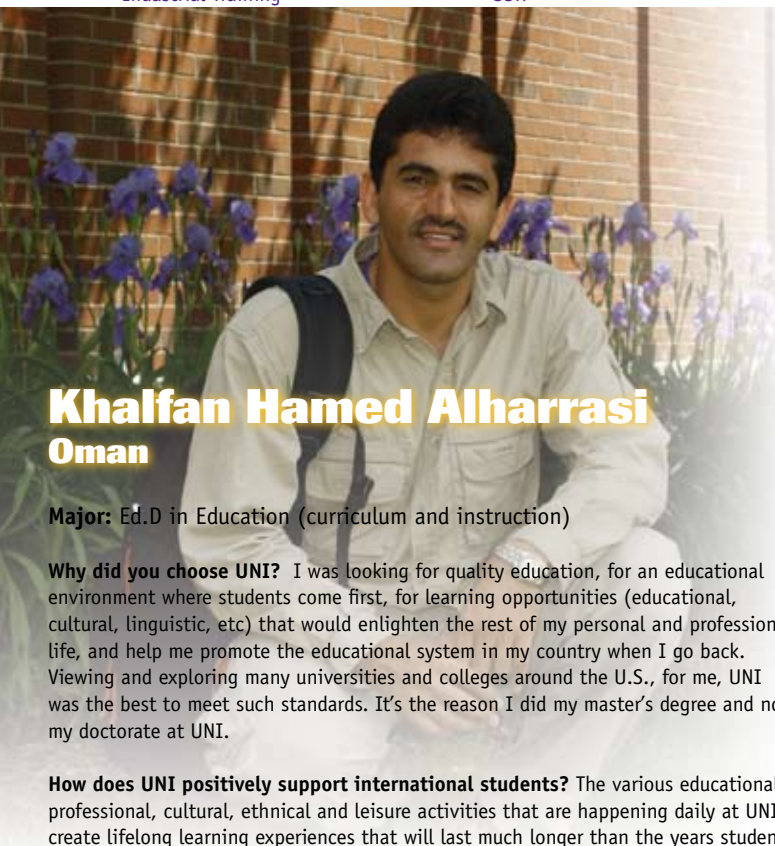

Why did you choose UNI? I was looking for quality education, for an educational environment where students come first, for learning opportunities (educational, cultural, linguistic, etc) that would enlighten the rest of my personal and professional life, and help me promote the educational system in my country when I go back. Viewing and exploring many universities and colleges around the U.S., for me, UNI was the best to meet such standards. It's the reason I did my master's degree and now my doctorate at UNI.

How does UNI positively support international students? The various educational, professional, cultural, ethnical and leisure activities that are happening daily at UNI create lifelong learning experiences that will last much longer than the years students

will physically spend at UNI. I am very impressed by the tremendous and continuous efforts ISO (International Students Organization) is making to support the international students on and off campus. Last, but not least, I was also amazed by the wide cultural knowledge and understanding my professors had for me as an international student, and how they could take this into consideration in coaching my learning experiences at UNI.

Are you involved in any extracurricular activities? Yes, I like to participate and get involved. There are numerous organizations, clubs, activities and events at UNI. As for me, I am a member of the MSA (Muslim Students Association), and a member of the International Students Soccer Club (ISSC). I also take part in the different trips, cultural evenings and events at GBPAC (Gallagher-Bluedorn Performing Arts Center).

What is the one thing you would tell an international student about attending a college in the United States? You will be in a different (and could be very different) educational and cultural environment. Do not assume that you'll know everything as time goes by; instead, always observe, ask questions, be flexible and ready to adapt, make serious efforts to learn and get the most out of your stay, get involved and participate in activities and events in your college, develop strong relationships with faculty, staff, colleagues and friends, and be efficient and punctual.

What has been the biggest difference between your native home and Iowa? Language, culture and food are among the differences between Oman (my country) and Iowa (and the U.S. in general). I come from a country where everybody speaks Arabic and are mono-cultural to a country where diversity, multilingualism and multiculturalism are increasing.
